This panel will serve as a platform for social justice efforts, especially to unite community voices and connect public opinion and perspectives to decision makers and policy advocates. The hired Panel Manager will be integral in the success of these innovative and community-driven efforts.

Primary Roles and Responsibilities

- Maintain understanding of panel enrollment, including target populations and identified gaps
- Manage participant incentives
- Collaborate with organizational stakeholders to design and implement panel surveys and process invoices
- Appraise current panel and polling literature to incorporate relevant aspects into paneling efforts
- Organize and participate in community outreach to enroll panel participants
- Identify and register for events in partnership with the Director of Communications & Community Outreach
- Collaborate to organize and support the Panel's Community Advisory Board (CAB), including scheduling meetings, support to create agendas, facilitation and note taking

Requirements/Qualifications

- Knowledge of longitudinal panel designs and familiarity including understanding of benefits and limitations
- Experience with data collection, management, analysis, and visualization
- Experience in survey methodologies, research, and evaluation
- Fundamental understanding of social justice issues, particularity as related to Metro Denver communities
- Demonstrated commitment to Metro Denver communities of color
- Ability to attend evening and weekend community events for panel recruitment purposes
- Experience utilizing Qualtrics' Research Suite and Target Audience desired

- Ability to perform several tasks concurrently, including time management and organizational skills
- A multi-tasker and team player with the ability to wear many hats in a fast-paced environment
- Ability to organize and maintain detailed records; complete necessary paperwork, reports and meet deadlines
- Strong computer skills, familiarity with Microsoft Office365, Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint
- Demonstrated ability to organize, set and implement priorities, manage multiple tasks with attention to detail
